

Duplin County operates collection sites to receive garbage and recyclables from it's rural residences and businesses. Operating costs are financed through annual availability fees and there is no additional charge for items delivered to the center. Attendants are on duty to insure proper placement of materials.



What about old furniture?

Bulky boxes are located at each collection center for the disposal of couches, chairs, mattresses, televisions, microwaves and other household furnishings.

Cover that load!

No vehicle should be driven on any highway unless it is loaded to prevent any of its load from falling, blowing, dropping, or escaping. Loads should be secured by tarps or other means to prevent littering.

Can't I just burn my garbage?

Law allows the burning of vegetative debris (leaves, limbs, stumps, etc.) only. It is illegal to burn anything else. Duplin County Sheriff's Office employs an Environmental Enforcement Officer to investigate and prosecute burning complaints, illegal dumping and littering violations. State law and Duplin's Solid Waste Management Ordinance provides for the prosecution of those persons who burn, dump trash on other's property or public roadways with stiff financial penalties and possible prison sentences.

Got tires?

Tires are accepted free of charge at Duplin's old landfill location northeast of Rose Hill.


When are the sites open?

What can I recycle?

A large part of the estimated 1800 pounds each Duplin County citizen disposes of each year can be recycled into new products. Recycling saves natural resources and helps conserve energy. Federal, state, and/or local laws prohibit the disposal of corrugated cardboard, beverage cans, lead-acid batteries, and motor oil in landfills. Please place these items in the designated container at the collection site. Refer to the chart below to find out what to recycle and how.

Materials Accepted	What to Recycle	How to Recycle	What Not to Include
Cardboard 	Corrugated Cardboard boxes. Mandatory	Empty, break down, and flatten the boxes. Place in cardboard container.	No waxed produce boxes or packing materials.
News and Mixed Paper 	Clean, dry newspapers and all the inserts that come with them, & mixed paper such as magazines, catalogs, mail, cereal boxes, office and school paper.	Place untied and unbagged news and mixed papers in the mixed paper container.	No newspaper used to drain foods or paper train an animal. No plastic bags.
Beverage Cans 	Aluminum beer and soft drink cans. Mandatory	Empty cans and place in beverage can bin.	No aluminum foil or pie plates.
Food Cans 	Steel (tin) cans used for fruit, vegetables, soups, juices, and other food items.	Rinse cans. Place in food can container. No need to remove labels.	No aerosol cans such as hairspray, shaving cream, spray paint, or cleanser cans.
#1 and #2 Plastic Containers 	Plastic soda bottles, milk jugs, detergent containers, shampoo bottles, etc. These plastic containers will have one of the following symbols on the bottom. 	Remove the lids, rinse and flatten. Check bottom of container for symbol and sort by code.	No tubs, pots, oil bottles or plastic grocery bags. 
Glass Bottles and Jars 	Clear, brown, and green glass bottles and jars.	Remove lids and rinse. Sort by color.	NO WINDOW PANES. Coffee cups, ceramics, mirrors, windshield glass, Pyrex dishes or light bulbs.
Motor Oil 	Oil from cars and other vehicles. Mandatory	Pour discarded oil into collection drum.	No oil mixed with water, anti-freeze, gasoline, or solvents of any kind.
Pesticide Containers 	Pesticide Containers.	Triple rinse or pressure rinse pesticide containers.	Instruction booklets or containers with residue.
Lead Acid Batteries 	Car, truck, marine, and mower batteries. Mandatory	Place discarded batteries on concrete collection pads.	No household (alkaline) batteries, NO NiCad batteries.
Scrap Metal 	Major appliances such as dishwashers, stoves and refrigerators and other scrap metals can be placed in a recycling bin at the collection center. For easier unloading, please take large loads to the old landfill location northeast of Rose Hill. There is no charge for scrap metal.
